That was, until now. A new breed of designer hostel is inspiring the fashionable and the fabulous to globe-hop on a budget, with sociable accommodation options no longer reserved solely for students.

With private rooms, branded interiors and unusual layouts, these prodigious pads will have your Instagram followers double tapping in no time.

GENERATOR, VENICE

Just a short watertaxi journey from the bustle of St Mark's Square, you'll find a collection of eight islands known as La Giudecca. On its waterfront sits an old grain house, which has been converted into an impossibly stylish and slightly eccentric hostel. Generator is filled with mosaic tiles, Murano glass, stone fireplaces and neon signs. If you thought power showers, fluffy towels and complementary toiletries were reserved for nice hotels, think again. This hostel offers all of the above in its rustic attic rooms, which even have exposed beams.

WHAT'S SPECIAL?

More to the point, what isn't special? Aside from a well thought out design, the hostel is geared towards being social, with a games room, bar, pool table and reading spaces.

#BUNK, ISTANBUL

#bunk's mantra is that those on a budget shouldn't compromise on style - it delivers on this promise, and then some. Istanbul has two hostels, #bunk Taksim offers modern décor and is walking distance from Taksim Square, while #bunk Beyoglu nods to the old Ottoman Empire and has the city's vibrant art scene on its doorstep. Each hostel has its own unique perks such as stylish coffee bars and sun terraces, so choose the one that best reflects your character.

WHAT'S SPECIAL?

Look up and you'll see prints of Istanbul's most impressive ceilings, from a beautiful mosque to the dome of Hagia Sophia.

Opened in 2010 by two women in their twenties, this is a real homegrown business. The aim of Coco Mama is to offer a boutique experience, which combines all the best parts of hostels and hotels, resulting in a laidback-luxe property. The striking building has high ceilings adorned with chandeliers, and rooms are decorated with their own quirky design - each one with its own special Dutch twist. Amsterdam is a small city, so it comes as no surprise that all of the major museums are mere minutes away.

THE CIRCUS HOTEL, BERLIN

The Circus Hotel offers three types of accommodation, all located on or near Rosenthaler Platz - otherwise known as one of the trendiest streets in Berlin. In the surrounding area you'll find small cafés, shops and the arts quarter, while all the big attractions are easily accessible through Berlin's seamless transport system.

The Full Cabins have double mattresses, while the exclusive Prince Cabin has the luxury of a queen-sized bed.

We doubt you've ever stayed at a hostel where the bathroom's have heated floors. There's even a landscaped roof terrace with views of Brooklyn
